

Kākāpō released on Maungatautari Maunga

Willow our Kawaka student had the absolute privilege to be part of the re-introduction of releasing $4 \times \text{male K\bar{a}k\bar{a}p\bar{o}}$ back to the North Island.

Willows grandad Pat Quin (pictured below) has been a volunteer at Maungatautari for many many years and way back in 1974 Pat was one of a group of conservation workers who discovered Kākāpō feathers after believing they had become extinct. The relocation trial of the 4 from Whenua Hou/Codfish Island came about as they now have run out of space for them on our South Island preditor free islands. There are now 248 Kākāpō left in existence today.

and also at the finish line. Email Ella if you are keen to help out (emuckle@pirongia.school.nz).


