Still only have 2 volunteers for such a big task. Please help if you can, even just for an hour or 2 over the day would help considerably.






Unleash your creativity in the Cat in the Hat Writing Competition! Channel your inner Dr. Seuss and craft a tale filled with mischief and rhymes.


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
